What is a MeG?

Our Minimum Expected Grade is a calculation based on a student's attainment at KS2. It is an indicator of the lowest outcome a student should expect in a subject at GCSE. This is **not** a target as generally a student is capable of achieving a higher grade but is given as a benchmark for helping to see progress. We sometimes don't have a MeG for certain subjects or where a child hasn't sat KS2 SATs. Where this is the case, we aim to set a MeG throughout the year.

Grades are averaged across all subjects to give an Average Points Score. The average of the grades for each subject. Compare the APS with the Average MeG.

Teachers are asked to score each student's attitude to learning in their lessons. This will include both classroom learning and quality/punctuality of homework and independent learning. Overall average scores are useful for comparison and spotting changes over time.

From next year, separate attitude in class and independent learning scores will be given.

The Average Overall Minimum Grade (MeG) is determined from all subjects where data is available

A MeG may be a whole number or shown as +. Our calculations are to 2 decimal places but final grades are whole numbers. If the average MeG is shown as 4+ it means that the average is between 4.50 and 4.99.

Teacher predicted grades are given for each examined subject. Teachers use assessment data and professional judgement to provide the grade they currently the student is most likely to attain at the end of the course. This prediction may change term on term as the course progresses. In Years 9 & 10 accuracy can be difficult and so we report a range of likely grade outcomes. As students progress through Year 10 and into Year 11 we will begin to report a single grade prediction where possible.
