Course Content

Students will cover units from the list below

- Performance and Leadership in Sport (5 Assignment Tasks)- 40% over overall grade - studied in year 9 and 10
- Increasing Awareness in Outdoor Adventurous Activities (4 Assignment Tasks) - 20% over overall grade -studied in year 10
- Contemporary Issues in Sport- EXAM- 40% over overall grade -studied in year 11

Non-Examined Assessment (Coursework)

Two of the three units are assessed via coursework assignments which are typed using PowerPoint, Word, OneNote, etc. They will be assessed via 9 assignment tasks across the units of Performance and Leadership in Sport and Increasing Awareness in Outdoor Adventurous Activities.

Practical

A small element of the Performance and Leadership in Sport and Increasing Awareness in Outdoor Adventurous Activities unit is assessed on practical ability, pupils will focus on a team and individual sport, for example, Basketball and Badminton, and Rock Climbing, and will be graded as a performer in each. During this unit, connected analysis assignments are completed in theory lessons.

Assessment

Weighting of lessons:

During the Non-examined assessment units, students will participate in an estimated 70% of lessons in a theory setting and 30% in practical lessons. The exam unit in Year 11 will consist of classroom-based work.

Written Exam:

“Contemporary Issues” is assessed via a written exam marked by external examiners

Grading:

Each internally assessed unit requires individual criteria to be met.

The overall assignments are then graded according to how many of which criteria have been achieved.

P – pass (equivalent to a GCSE grade 4)

M – merit (equivalent to a GCSE grade 5/6)

D – distinction (equivalent to a GCSE grade 7)

To gain a Pass at the end of Year 11 – all PASS criteria must have been met. To gain a Merit at the end of Year 11 – all PASS criteria and MERIT criteria must have been met. To gain a Distinction at the end of Year 11 – all PASS / MERIT / DISTINCTION criteria must have been met.
